When I was in Pakistan we had a gateman called; Allah Ditta. What a man! He was elderly and had no-where to live so he had come to be with us. His job was important because we had over 200 girls in the hostel and we needed to be careful about who came in and out. His job was to go to the gate when it was knocked, check who it was and let them in or get Catherine, the missionary, to come and speak to them. He lived in a wee house just inside the garden wall beside the gate. He was not the most energetic of workers and was often found with his hookah smoking tobacco or bits of old rope or dear knows what. He was bouncy and cheery and loveable but full of excuses: I am sorry Miss Saab, I was washing my clothes and didn't hear the gate, I was looking at the flowers and didn't hear the gate; I needed to go and see if my friend's sister's daughter's neighbour's brother's uncle knew who could mend my shoes. One day he came to the door, he wanted to get an advance on his wages. Having not been successful - because Catherine knew it wouldn't be spent on food but something frivolous, he looked at her and smiled his toothless grin in his well worn face and said: But Miss Saab, you don't understand. My name is Allah Ditta, which means God's Gift and I am God's Gift to you! We all laughed, including him, but he still didn't get his money.

Now I could be bold and say that last year I was God's Gift to you, and maybe, like Catherine and I with Allah Ditta you will burst into fits of laughter. But truth be told, I feel that you have been God's Gift to me. I know you were the right congregation when the time came for me to move on from Kingussie. I have

thoroughly enjoyed my first year with you. And I have been blessed with so many gifts: my Elders and Board members and their commitment and dedication; those who look after the church buildings and make sure that the services go smoothly - from cleaning to flowers to music and more - oh, the list is endless. But more than that, those who are very special, who would have been wrapped in beautiful paper with gold bows, are those of you who have taken the chance and stepped out of your comfort zone to try and cope with the changes that a new minister brings, who have been prepared to try new things and give it a go. And so we have Cuppa and Chat in Auchencairn; and so we have a Worship Team who can lead worship when I am not here; so we have Elders who have had to take on new Elders' districts - becoming part of the lives of people they don't know well.

Thank you all. God made me a lucky lady when he gave me you. And you know, the people of this Parish may not completely value it, but you are also a special gift for them. For God has given you the privilege of sharing his love with them - and what more beautiful time of year to share that love than at Christmas!

God bless you at Christmas and I do hope you will be able to come to some of our Christmas celebrations.

He was born in an animal pen and laid in a feeding trough. The family struggled with problems of hunger, homelessness and physical danger when Jesus’ life was threatened.”*

The next time someone says “It’s really for the children” in your hearing perhaps you’ll remind them of the real story and refer to the many people still facing so many hardships today, but also of the hope and the love we can all have in Jesus.
